PALS (Pairs and Learn Session)



Parish Ambassadors and Service Projects

Service Projects are administered through volunteer members who are Parish Ambassadors and act as liaisons to designated parish schools in the San Gabriel Valley. Communicating with the schools' principals throughout the year, our ambassadors identify the needs of the most underprivileged children at the schools and invite the principals to submit requests for funds to support those needs. As a result, our Service Projects program (Christmas Stocking Fund & Easter Shoes) pays for items such as uniforms, registration, sacramental fees, and lunch for the neediest children at the schools. 

National Christ Child Society Convention

The National Christ Child Society 2022 Convention Together in Tucson – A Great Success!

Kelley.



The setting was the beautiful Loews Ventana Canyon Resort which is built right into a mountain whose vista was fluid throughout the day depending on the sunlight. There was an optional tour of Tucson on Thursday morning. Highlights included a stop at the St. Augustine Cathedral and Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton School for the ribbon cutting of the Christ Child Society of Tucsondonated book vending machine. The students loved it! Then the tour was off to "The White Dove of the Desert" – also known as Mission San Xavier del Bac - the northernmost mission founded in 1692 by Jesuit priest Padre Eusebio Kino. The tour concluded with stops for James Beard award winning Sonora Dogs (hot dog wrapped in bacon and topped with beans, fresh, grilled onions, tomatoes, mayo, mustard, and jalapeno sauce), and dessert (shaved ice with a scoop of ice cream, fresh fruit of your choice, and
